What are we learning?

 Question 9 of the survey asks "What Are the Primary Most Critical Resources Needed in Your Program"

 Question 10 of the survey asks "What Are the Secondary Most Critical Resources Needed in Your Program"

Most Important Resources

57.14% said "people" was most important need

 42.84% said "resources" was most important need

 22.08 % said "involvement was the most important need

Secondary Most Important Resources

- 55.15% said "resources" was the second most important need
- 27.2% said "people" was the second most important need
- 14.71% said "involvement" was the second most important need

Definitions

- The questions were open ended, and therefore the answers needed more analysis
- These definitions are designed to help the reader understand the way answers were categorized
- The four main answer categories were:
 - People
 - Funding
 - Involvement
 - Other

Definitions Continued People

- Volunteers Respondent indicated that there is a need for volunteers who DO NOT necessarily need to be tutor/mentors
- **Tutor/mentors** Respondent specified that there are volunteers needed to fill roles of tutor/mentors
- Paid Staff Respondent indicated that there is need for more staff in the program, which can be directly correlated with the need for funds

Definitions Continued

Resources

Paid Staff – Same as on previous page
Money/Funding – Respondent indicated that funding/money is needed to support the program

Other Resources – Responded indicated that there are other resources needed, but can be taken care of by addition funding. These resources include, but are not limited to more space, playgrounds, more computers, software, training materials...

Definitions Continued Involvement

- Participants Respondent indicated that there is a need for more children, students, or other types of members who will directly participate in the program
- Families There is a need for increased participation from families of the direct participants
- Community/Other Need for participation from leaders, local businesses, schools, teachers as well as other agencies in the community


Definitions Continued Other

They include:


- Planning/Organization, Goals/Direction and Leadership/Expertise

Q #9 - Primary Most Critical Resources




57.14% indicted a need for people42.84% showed a need for more resources22.08% specified a need for more involvement

Q # 9 - Percentage Breakdown of Other




Due to the wide range of open ended answers, 50% of "other" still doesn't fit in any of the above categories. To see what other issues were indicated please take the survey and view complete results.
